Description

The MD5-1 monoclonal antibody reacts with mouse death receptor 5 (DR5) also known as CD262 and TRAIL-R2. DR5 is a 55 kDa member of the TNF receptor superfamily and is expressed by most cell types. Upon binding to its ligand TRAIL, DR5 activates NF-kB and induces TRAIL-mediated apoptosis. The MD5-1 antibody has been shown to induce TRAIL-mediated apoptosis in vitro and in vivo.

Storage

Store at the stock concentration at 4°C. Do not freeze.

It is not uncommon for a floccule or precipitate to appear during storage. The floccule is typically buffer salts precipitating out of solution or a small bit of protein aggregation. For information on how to remove floccules or precipitates see our FAQ's at https://bioxcell.com/fags.
